
## **Individualized Major Guidelines**

The Individualized Major Program is available for students who have an unusual breadth of academic preparation, a high level of motivation and perseverance, and the ability to assume independence in undertaking their academic work. This program, designed by the student along with a faculty committee or advisor, is designed to meet the student's individual needs as they pertain to the student's area of concentration. The Individualized Major will contain mostly regular SNC courses with additional special topics, internships, independent study courses, and transfer credits as applicable to meet the student's needs. Specific procedures are as follows:

- 1. Students have the option of structuring an Individualized Major program on a divisional or cross-divisional basis. Students select an advisor, and together they structure a major program. For interdisciplinary majors two or more advisors may be selected. Students and advisors should consult with colleagues within the College who may have personal expertise and experience within the chosen area of study.
- 2. Proposals should be submitted by the end of the sophomore year or for advanced transfer students after their first semester .
- 3. Proposals should be submitted to an appropriate Divisional Associate Academic Dean for initial review. The application will then be forwarded to the Dean of the College for approval. The application is then forwarded to the Office of the Registrar to verify accuracy and policy compliance before final approval.
- 4. Appeals of denied applications can be made to the Committee on Curriculum and Educational Policy.
- 5. Upon graduation the Individualized Major along with program title is placed on the student transcript. IM majors qualify for a BA degree unless otherwise petitioned by the student to the Office of the Registrar.

## Specific Requirements for Individualized Majors

- 1. Majors must have a minimum of 10 courses and with a minimum of 5 courses at or above the 300 level.
- 2. Applicants are encouraged to include a designated culminating experience or capstone course.
- 3. Students having a Social Science related major must include SSCI 224 or an equivalent course within their program.
- 4. Students must provide in their proposal a program rationale, title, individualized statement of academic and career goals and objectives, courses included, and a semester completion plan including General Education.
- 5. A student pursuing an Individualized Major may not pursue a second major or a minor in a related area.
- 6. Students pursuing an Individualized Major must be in good standing and are expected to stay in good standing.
- 7. Once approved, the student is required to monitor their progress for graduation and register in a timely manner for all regular and special courses. All changes to an approved proposal must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar via a completed Substitution Form. Depending on the change requested, the Academic Dean's approval may be needed.
- 8. All regular graduation requirements (residency, 2.00 GPA in major, major/General Ed double counting, etc.) will apply .
- 9. If an IM proposal contains any independent studies or arranged course, a supplemental statement of agreement to teach the course by the instructor must accompany the proposal.
